2) AP and IB Credits

AP scores of 3 or above are accepted for **Prolless** of Microeconomics (ECON 160) Principles of Macroeconomics (ECON 162) Statistics and Calculus. A score of 3 is considered equivalent to a grade of C, a score of 4 is considered equivalent to a grade of B, etc. IB higher Ilscores are also acted IB standard level scores are not accepted.

3) <u>Hybrid (Micro and Macro Principles Courses)</u>

Some schoolsincluding Syracuse University and SUNMony Brook, offer a combined micro/macro principles course. In such cases course will be accepted ECON 162, Principles of Macroeconomics

4) All other courses taken anywhere other than Binghamton University (including all SUNY/CUNY schools) must be approved in advance by the Director of Undergraduate Studies in Economics.

Before you decide to take a course elsewhere, please check to make sure that you comply with the residency requirement of your degree (available on the department website).

Courses taken through a stually road program sponsored by BU may count as BU courses. Consult the Diffrector Undergraduate Studies fore you make plans for such programs.
